When several high-profile banks entered liquidation under financial distress in March of 2023, analysts estimated that over 90% of clients had cash deposits exceeding the \$250,000 insured by the FDIC.

Impact Deposits Corp.'s program insulates our cash depositors from the possibility of losses, while dedicating a portion of our revenue from such deposits to help communities nationwide.





This report will show you how our Social Impact Depositor Program™ protects your deposits, while at the same time donating a portion of *our earned revenue* to create social capital that benefits nonprofits nationwide.

We've donated over \$13,000,000 of our basis interest points to benefit 400 non-profits to date.



What is FDIC/NCUA Insurance?




Deposit insurance is one of the significant benefits of having an account at an FDIC-insured bank or NCUA-insured credit union — it is how the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and the National Credit Union Administration protect your money in the event of an organization failure. The maximum amount insured is \$250,000 per depositor, per insured bank/credit union, for each account ownership category. Impact Deposits Corp. empowers you to achieve full FDIC/NCUA insurance for the entirety of your cash assets, by allocating them throughout our cash deposit network of banks.

Calling herself a "street vet", Tarshea notes, "I've experienced it myself. I know how it feels to sleep on a porch...I know what my people need because I also needed consistency and love, and for somebody just to be in my corner until I was able to do that for myself. Fortunately, I found a group of people who believed in me and gave me this opportunity."

Tarshea found Impact Deposits Corp. in 2016 when she was working for one of the nonprofits we support, Ladies Empowerment and Action Program (LEAP). She had just become a "returning citizen" after being incarcerated, and was working with LEAP to help women in prison study entrepreneurship and learn employment and life skills needed for a successful reentry into society.

At the time, LEAP was centered at the Center for Social Change, and when Founder Bill Burdette asked what her **greatest challenge** was, Tarshea answered with one word: housing.




Recognizing LEAP's need for permanent housing, Bill Burdette partnered with the nonprofit to buy a house that served as a group home for LEAP clients. Named Sacred House, it was set up and run by Tarshea. This experience taught her much about how to create a harmonious, healing atmosphere for individuals living together, "I found people who I thought would be a good fit for the dynamics of the house, for a place with affordable housing, community living."


Having established Sacred House, Tarshea began working at Impact Deposit Corp.'s Center for Social Change in Miami, eventually assuming the role of Director of Special Events. In April of 2021, Bill Burdette elevated her to Executive Director of Community Building Institute.

Community Building Institute now runs X residences in Jacksonville, Florida—one with 10 bedrooms for female veterans, another with X rooms for young adults aging out of the foster care system, operated in coordination with Dreams and Success Homes. One thing that all of these homes have in common is Tarshea's commitment to bringing people facing similar life challenges together.

"I allow the clients, or tenants, of each house to create their own community," Tarshea relates. "They interview the people who are applying to live there to see if they will be a good fit. Because they're going to have to live together, not me."

DASH FOUNDATION HELPS FOSTER CARE KIDS GROW INTO SUCCESSFUL, INDEPENDENT ADULTS

Mike Williams entered Florida's foster care system when he was twelve years old; by the age of eighteen he had lived in forty different homes. After aging out of the system, Mike sought to distance himself from his past by moving as far away as he could to go to college, only to find his transition to adulthood fraught with hurdles. "I was running away from all of the tangible support for things like being mentored, being coached, and I just wanted to do my own thing," Mike remembers. "So when I jumped out at eighteen, within two years I got caught up in the nightlife having fun, not understanding how to handle responsibility. Soon I quit school and started working full-time; but then I ended up getting fired. I obviously couldn't pay any of my bills anymore, and so I had to live in my car."



While this trajectory may seem extreme, it isn't unusual. Only 5% of children twelve years or older are adopted. Those who do not find a forever family spend their adolescent years in residential or group homes, or in juvenile justice programs. More than 20,000 teens age out of the U.S. foster care system each year with nowhere to go for support. Their futures are often troubled.

50% will become homeless within the first year

25% will be arrested within 2 years

Less than 3% complete a college degree, or find full-time employment by age 23



7 out of 10 girls will become pregnant before the age of 21

Today, Mike Williams is the Founder and CEO of DASH Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that provides experiential learning programs to educate, support and develop young adults aging out of foster care. He has leveraged his experience with the foster system to help shape Florida laws and develop statewide programs and conferences that instill confidence, teach strategies and foster resilience in young people as they transition to successful independent, adult living.



The DASH Foundation model is based on responsible communal living with professional support. It has two components: SMART DREAMS housing and coaching. Young people who enroll in the coaching program are eligible to apply for SMART DREAM housing in one of twelve homes and seven one-bedroom apartment units. Altogether, DASH housing currently has thirty-nine beds, but is looking to grow.

The DASH houses located in Jacksonville have been donated by Impact Deposit Corp. and operate as part of its Community Building Institute.

These group homes house several young members as well as a Coach who may be an alumni of the program, or simply an adult further along in their journey towards independence and a full time job. Coaches receive free housing in exchange for supporting the young people in the house in their studies, and empowering them to embrace the mentoring process.

Importantly, members are paired with volunteer Mentors who have completed professional training development. Mentors are chosen for their specific interests and strengths, to help members navigate such adult challenges as achieving financial literacy, maintaining a healthy lifestyle and gaining access to health care—or even simply learning how to celebrate successes in life as they grow and reward themselves in responsible ways.
